Thereafter, Babylonia ceased to be independent, passing eventually in 331 bce to Alexander the Great, who planned to make Babylon the capital of his empire and who died in Nebuchadnezzar's palace. After Alexander's death, however, the Seleucids eventually abandoned Babylon, bringing an end to one of the greatest empires in history.

Babylonian Captivity, also called Babylonian Exile, the forced detention of Jews in Babylonia following the latter's conquest of the kingdom of Judah in 598/7 and 587/6 bce. The captivity formally ended in 538 bce, when the Persian conqueror of Babylonia, Cyrus the Great, gave the Jews permission to return to Palestine.

The Babylonians did not technically have a digit for, nor a concept of, the number zero. Although they understood the idea of nothingness , it was not seen as a number/merely the lack of a number. Later Babylonian texts used a placeholder () to represent zero, but only in the medial positions, and not on the right-hand side of the number, as we do in numbers like 100 .
